

Anti Human Trafficking Apps

Reporting Apps

RedLight Traffic (Free) - Available on iOS 6.1 and up

Anonymously report suspicious incidents, locations, and possible victims using this app. The information is given to relevant law enforcement and anti human trafficking organizations. Includes signs of human trafficking to help you identify victims.

Operation Compass (Free) - Available on Android 4.0.3 and iOS 6.0 (and up)

Including the ability to report human trafficking incidents, this app also has a unique feature that helps victims of human trafficking “find their way home”.

Freedom! By Orphan Secure (Free) - Available on Android 2.2 and up

As a part of Orphan Secure's big data initiative to report human trafficking, you report suspicious incidents, which are then received by the Anti-Human Trafficking Intelligence Cell where the information is then processed, analyzed and disseminated to allow for direct action

The STOP APP - End Human Trafficking (Free) - Available on Android 4.0 and iOS 8.0 (and up)

This app helps people understand what human trafficking is and how to detect it, and provides a platform for people to report human trafficking incidents observed or experienced

Other ways to help

TraffickCam (Free) - Available on Android 4.0.3 and iOS 8.2 (and up)

Take pictures of hotel rooms, to help the police identify locations of victims. Traffickers regularly post photographs of their victims posed in hotel rooms for online advertisements. In order to use these photos, however, investigators must be able to determine where the photos were taken.

Ethical Barcode (Free) - Available on Android 2.3.3 and iOS 6.0 (and up)

With this app, scan barcodes and discover how these products are made. Companies involved in making the product are listed, including various nonprofit ratings on their status on human trafficking, animal testing, LGBT discrimination, and climate change. The app unfortunately does not recognize many products, although those of major companies (Costco, Procter & Gamble, Heinz, Kellogg's) are generally recognized.

GraceCity (Free) - Available on Android 4.0 and up

This app provides a list of nearby emergency resources for those in need: shelters, medical help, legal assistance, and even spiritual support. With this app, you can contact shelters, identify victims with its list of warning signs, and learn about the resources in your county. This is good for any situations when you or someone near you needs any help or if you would like to find organizations to volunteer in. Applicable only in certain counties in the U.S.

TrafficStop (Free) - Available on Android 2.3 and up

Get the phone numbers and contact information of anti-human trafficking organizations, and be a part of an internet community against this issue. Take quizzes to test your knowledge of human trafficking.

BAN Human Trafficking! (Free) - Available on Android 2.2 and up

This interactive game educates users on how human trafficking issues, including the problem itself and later difficulties with recovery. The game goes through a potential human trafficking victim's life, from his or her recruitment to suffering and eventual recovery.

Sweat & Toil by U.S. Department of Labor (Free) - Available on Android 4.0.3 and iOS 8.1 (and up)

Learn about human trafficking around the world. This app has information on child and forced labor in countries worldwide, from Afghanistan to Zimbabwe. There are also specified exports from these countries that are created with human trafficking: chocolate, soccer balls, and various foods. Although specific products and companies are not named, this app can not be used to check products to buy, but it is a good resource to learn about global slavery in the economy.
